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Español 3

¡Hola y bienvenido/a a la clase de Español 3! Learning another language not only dramatically increases your chances for success in the future, it is also a fun and interesting way to learn about other peoples and cultures. Third year Spanish is a critical year in your study of Spanish, as you will build upon your foundation from Spanish one and two, moving closer to fluency. As students of Spanish, you will acquire proficiency in the four modalities of language learning: reading, writing, speaking and listening. In Spanish 3 we will be covering 8 thematic units. Below you will find important information that will help you to be successful in this class.

Las normas de la clase de español:

- 1). **Tarea de casa:** Students should expect homework to be assigned every day. Homework will be collected and graded **randomly**. Homework will be graded the following: 5 points for every completed worksheet and a varying amount of points for authentic work (as determined by the assignment). Please note: **Credit will only be given for quality work**. It is important to complete homework on time, as late homework **will not be accepted**. If you are absent you must hand in the prior day's homework upon your return and will have one day to make up the missed work. You place this homework in the "Hand in to Sra. Ratcliffe level 3" folder. Homework will be **posted on the board** each day and may or may not be on the portal. It is each student's responsibility to write it down during the first 2 minutes of class.
- 2). **Participación:** In order to improve the four modalities of language (reading, writing, speaking, and listening), it is important to participate actively on a daily basis. Because the best way to learn a language is by immersing oneself in it, the class will be conducted entirely in Spanish. Each student's participation grade will be determined by: (1) daily contribution to **class discussions**, (2) effort to speak **Spanish**,
- (3) **Staying on task** during classroom activities, (4) regular attendance and punctuality. Students will lose points for speaking in English.
- 3.) **Ausencias / Tardanzas**: Students should make every effort to be in class every day and ON TIME. Frequent absences and/or tardies will severely affect the participation portion of your grade. After an excused absence, please provide a note; otherwise, it will be an unexcused absence. In addition, if for any reason a student needs to be dismissed early from class, they **MUST** provide a note.
- 4). **Exámenes y pruebas:** We will have at least one quiz and/or test weekly. This helps students stay accountable to memorizing/internalizing the target grammar and vocabulary. If you are absent on a quiz or test date, I need a valid note explaining the absence so that you may make up the exam. You have 2 weeks to make up the assessment or it becomes a zero.
- 5). **Proyectos:** Students should expect one project and/or oral presentation per thematic unit. Students will be given the assignment and rubric at least 1-2 weeks before the project is due.
- 6). **Plagio**: According to *Merriam Webster*, to plagiarize is "to steal and pass off (the ideas or words of another) as one's own: use (another's production) without crediting the source." Copying homework is therefore a form of plagiarism. In addition to plagiarism, beware of online translators. Since computers cannot think, it is always apparent when a student uses a translator.
- 7). **Respeto**: Respect is a key component of any learning community. In addition to following all of the Beacon School's code of conduct and rules (No gum, no food in class, no hats, no electronics, no graffiti, and no cursing) I also expect each student to be respectful of him/herself and of everyone else.
- 8.) **Tutoring:** Students are expected to come to tutoring hours prepared with questions regarding the class material. If a student has failed an assessment, a tutoring session must be completed that same week.
- 9.) **Los cuadernos:** Each student is required to keep a Spanish notebook (3-ring binder). At the end of each semester, (not quarter) students may empty the contents and bring those materials home. It is important to keep all in-class and outside

materials in your notebook at all times. <u>Open notebook quiz/tests or notebook checks may be given at different times throughout the semester.</u>
